

**Effects of the Great East Japan Earthquake on the TAMURA Group  
(June 7, Final report)**

This is to announce the effects of the Great East Japan Earthquake on our Group and the damage caused thereto, as well as the restoration status as of 10:00 of June 7.

The resumption of full operation at Wakayanagi Tamura Corporation on June 6 marked the recovery of production of our Group to the pre-March 11 level.

Aizu Tamura Corporation, the plant nearest to the Fukushima nuclear power plants, is more than 100 km (62 miles) away and was not affected at all.

**Wakayanagi Tamura Corporation (Kurihara City, Miyagi Prefecture)**

**Products: Transformer, Electronic components**

The inside of the factory building had been damaged by the earthquakes on March 11 and April 7. Except for certain parts of the factory that were damaged, partial production was resumed on April 1 and our group companies extended assistance by taking charge of production and shipment on behalf of the factory. On June 6, restoration work for the factory was almost completed, and that part of production taken charge by our group companies could finally be restarted at the factory. With these developments, the operation of the factory was fully recovered.

**Aizu Tamura Corporation (Onuma County, Fukushima Prefecture)**

**Products: Power supply, LED related products, Information equipment**

The inside of the building had been partly damaged, but production was resumed on March 16. The factory is operating as usual.

**Sakado Factory (Sakado City, Saitama Prefecture)**

**Products: Piezoelectric ceramic products, Transformer and Coil**

Production at the piezoelectric-ceramics-related factory had temporarily been suspended because its firing furnace could not be operated continuously due to rolling blackouts, but had been resumed on April 4 and shipped gradually starting on April 11. The factory is operating as usual.

No major damage has been reported on the buildings and facilities of other factories and subsidiaries of our Group.

However, our production activities are still affected by the difficulty of procuring certain parts and materials from suppliers that have incurred damage from the disaster. In the future, if it is feared that customers will be affected, sales representatives will inform them as necessary.
